

# Wolfnet KSAGG Painting Competition

## Overview:

The KSAGG painting competition has three categories, including:

- Single Miniature
- Diorama
- Marauder

Each category will have Gold (1st place), Silver (2nd place) and Bronze (3rd place) awards. In addition, one Best in Show prize award will be given to the entry judged to be the best painted across all of the categories.

## How to Enter:

You must purchase a badge to KSAGG in order to enter.

Entries will be accepted at KSAGG starting Friday @ 2pm and ending Saturday @ 5pm.

The awards will be made public at KSAGG @ 8pm Saturday

## Entry Guidelines:

All entries must be officially released or licensed Battletech models.

You may submit one entry into each category.

Entries must be submitted in person by the artist who painted the entry. No other entries will be accepted.

## Category guidelines:

**Single Miniature:** This category is for any single miniature size light, medium, heavy, or assault. Miniatures larger than the listed size will be entered into the Diorama category. Entries should be on a hex base, but can also be mounted on a base up to 2" wide and deep. Miniatures may also be mounted on a small plinth up to 2" wide, 2" deep, and 2" high.

**Diorama:** This category includes scenic displays and duels. A diorama base can be up to 12" wide, 12" deep, and 12" high.

**Marauder:** Paint a Marauder! As long as it's an official model and is a "Marauder," it's valid! MAD-3R? Sure! Marauder IIC? Heck yeah! Marauder battle armor? Why not! This paint

challenge is more about creativity, interpretation and expression over technical execution. This category follows the same rules for basing as the Single Miniature category.

**FAQ:**

**I have an idea, but I don't know if it would be legal entry. What should I do?**

**I can enter miniatures I paid a commissioned painter to paint for me, right?**

No, models entered into the KSAGG paint competition must be painted by the entrant. NO EXCEPTIONS

<i>The miniature does not meet the minimum 3-colors-and-based requirement. (No additional points to be awarded)</i>						
<b>Basic Painting</b>						<b>10 pts</b>
<i>The miniature meets the 3-colors-and-based minimum standard.</i>						
<b>Intermediate Painting</b>						<b>15 pts</b>
<i>The miniature is painted above the basic requirement.</i>						
<b>Advanced Painting</b>						<b>20pts</b>
<i>The miniature is painted beyond the basic standard and shows additional effort/technique.</i>						
<b>Expert Painting</b>						<b>25 pts</b>
<i>The miniature is painted with a further eye for detail and the application of advanced techniques.</i>						
<b>Display Level</b>						<b>30 pts</b>
<i>The miniature shows an exceptional level of effort, technique and skill.</i>

<b>Advanced Details</b>	0 pts	1 pt	2 pts	3 pts	4pts	5 pts
<i>Award these points for use of advanced techniques, such as multiple layers of highlights, blending, OSL, non-metallic metals, weathering etc.</i>
